Graduation is the tangible success of a student's transformation by God's grace and by means of the following Gospel Center Rescue Mission (GCRM) Core Programs:

Eight Core Gospel Center Rescue Mission (GCRM) Programs

New Life Programs:

2 FREE residential 6 month Phases with a 1 Year Transitional Housing Phase. 1st Phase manages addiction to recovery for men and women providing spiritual, emotional and physical health classes, work therapy and positive community activities. 2nd Phase continues community service, job acquisition or vocational training, GED or basic literacy, and transitional housing towards permanent housing. Student's children reside on Campus.

Emergency Lodging:

FREE overnight program includes a bed, shower, dinner and breakfast for up to 100 men, women and women with Children year-round.

Community Feeding:

Preparation of up to 500 hot meals and distribution of 1,500 cold meals each day year-round.

Clothing Plus:

FREE clothing, furniture and household goods available to people in need. The Mission annually picks up and distributes approximately 100,000 pieces of clothing, furniture and other household items.

Recuperative Care:

Serves Homeless transitioning from a hospital to the care that a family member would provide if the client were recuperating at home. GCRM operates the only non-profit Recuperative Care Program in San Joaquin County.

SSI Representative Payee Services:

GCRM is 1 of 2 non-profits managing SSI benefits to the Homeless in San Joaquin County. GCRM serves up to 600 clients annually processing approximately \$6M in SSI benefits.

Disaster Refugee Relief:

Should a natural disaster or terrorism event occur in San Joaquin County, the Rescue Mission can accommodate for several weeks an additional 50 refugees (beyond its Emergency Lodging) with lodging, food and clothing. When refugees return to other housing the Mission can further assist with furniture through its Clothing Plus.

FREE Non-Profit Training:

GCRM trains and gives any Program information to any non-profit upon request.
